Carolina Buckthorn	<i>Rhamnus caroliniana</i>	10'-15' X 15'	Open Spreading	D	S/SH	An attractive, adaptable small tree with red and black berries in summer and fall. Will grow in acid sand, alkali clay, or limestone rock.
Cedar, Blue Atlas	<i>Cedrus atlantica glauca var.</i>	30'-40' X 20'	Pyramidal	E	S/PSH	Bold pyramidal form with sparkling, silvery-blue foliage. Needles occur in dense tufts, so even young plants have a bonsai-like look. Slow growth rate.
Cedar, Deodar	<i>Cedrus deodara</i>	60'+ X 40'	Pyramidal	E	S/PSH	Broad pyramidal evergreen tree with gracefully pendulous branches. Light blue or grayish green needles.
Cedar, Eastern Red	<i>Juniperus virginiana</i>	30'-40' X 20'	Conical, Spreading	E	S/PSH	Native moderate grower. Extremely adaptable. Females have blue berries. Attracts wildlife.

Chaste Tree, Monk's Pepper	<i>Vitex agnus-castus</i>	10'-15' X 20'	Upright, Spreading	D	SUN	Fragrant clusters of blue, pink or white flowers, aromatic foliage, and seeds with herbal uses make this a particularly useful small tree. Naturalized across the South, very hardy and problem free.
Cherry Laurel	<i>Prunus caroliniana</i>	20'-30' X 4'	Pyramidal	E	S/PSH	Glossy evergreen leaves and dense growth. Attractive to birds. Needs good drainage and organic soil.
Cherry, 'Kwanzan' Flowering	<i>Prunus serrulata</i>	20'-30' X 15'	Upright, Spreading	D	S/PSH	Covered with clusters of large, double deep-pink blooms backed by bronzy-red new growth in early spring.
Chinese Pistache	<i>Pistacia chinensis</i>	40'-60' X 30'	Oval	D	SUN	Fast grower. Beautiful red, orange and yellow fall foliage. Very hardy with attractive bark.
Crabapple, 'Radiant'	<i>Malus x hybrida</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Rounded	D	S/PSH	Ornamental flowering tree with deep pink blooms in spring. Small bright red fruit in fall. Foliage is bronze green.
Crabapple, 'Snow'	<i>Malus x hybrida</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Rounded	D	S/PSH	White flowers in the spring, rounded dense habit, dark green foliage. Orange-red fruit in fall.
Crape Myrtle, 'Natchez'	<i>Lagerstroemia x fauriei</i>	15'-20' X 20'-25'	Upright, Spreading	D	SUN	Dark cinnamon-brown exfoliating bark remains attractive throughout the year. Dark green leaves change to orange-red in fall before dropping. Pure white flowers.
Crape Myrtle, Tuscarora	<i>Lagerstroemia</i>	18"-24" X 15'	Open Spreading	D	SUN	Deciduous green leaves that turn to orange, red, and yellow in the fall. Produces showy red/orange flowers and has brown/green, droopy branches.
Cypress, Bald	<i>Taxodium distichum</i>	60'+ X 60'	Upright, Pyramidal	D	S/PSH	Fast grower. Requires ample water, but is very adaptable. Smooth cones. Copper fall foliage.
Cypress, 'Blue Ice' Arizona	<i>Cupressus arizonica</i>	15'-30' X 15'	Conical, Spreading	E	SUN	A nice tight growing extra light silvery blue conical evergreen. Very widely adapted, does better in Dallas than most junipers. Wind hardy & drought tolerant.
Cypress, Compact Arizona	<i>Cupressus arizonica compacta</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Conical, Spreading	E	SUN	This is a dense, blueish-green form of the Arizona cypress. Fast growing and hardy.
Cypress, Leyland	<i>Cupressocyparis leylandii</i>	20'-30' X 10'	Pyramidal	E	SUN	Fast grower. Great windbreak tree. Requires a good amount of water.
Desert Willow	<i>Chilopsis linearis</i>	20'-30' X 15'	Upright, Spreading	D	S/PSH	Native. Fast grower. Prolific white to pink to purple flowers from spring to fall. Few disease problems. Very heat and drought resistant.
Dogwood, 'Cherokee Princess' Flowering	<i>Cornus florida</i>	15'-20' X 20'	Spreading	D	PSH	Flowers early spring with large white bracts reaching to 4" across. Blooms more heavily than other species. Fall foliage is maroon-red followed by red fruit.
Dogwood, Flowering	<i>Cornus florida</i>	15'-20' X 20'	Layered	D	PSH	Slow grower. Showy flowers of red or pink in early spring. Beautiful, red fruit in fall/winter and striking red foliage. Prefers acid, well drained soil.
Dogwood, Roughleaf	<i>Cornus drummondii</i>	10'-15' X 20'	Somewhat Rounded	D	S/SH	Native moderate grower. White flowers in spring, fall foliage is red to pink and white berries appear in early fall. Great for alkaline soil.

Elm, Cedar	<i>Ulmus crassifolia</i>	60'+ X 50'	Upright, Spreading	D	SUN	Native to N. Texas. Moderate growing to eventually become a large shade tree. Very hardy with an irregular shape. Foliage turns yellow to gold in fall.	
Elm, Lacebark	<i>Ulmus parvifolia</i>	40'-60' X 40'	Rounded	D	SUN	Moderate grower. Delicate foliage and splendid, exfoliating bark. Attractive yellow to burgundy foliage in fall. Native to China, but it is as good, or better adapted, than our native elms to our area.	
Eve's Necklace	<i>Sophora affinis</i>	15'-20' X 12'	Rounded	D	S/PSH	Native fast grower when young. Pink flower clusters in spring. Beaded, black fruit in fall/winter. Yellow fall foliage and drought tolerant. Adaptable to any well drained soil.	
Flowering Cherry, 'Kwanzan'	<i>Prunus serrulta</i>	20'-30' X 20'	Rounded	D	SUN	Similar in habit to "Kwanzan," with reddish purple foliage and deeper pink flowers. Deciduous flowering ornamental, coppery red, peeling bark, and foliage turns golden color in the fall.	
Flowering Cherry, 'Yoshino'	<i>Prunus serrulata</i>	20'-30' X 20'	Open Spreading	D	SUN	A small variety of the flowering cherries, "Shirofugen" blooms profusely in the Spring, with fragrant double white hanging clusters, and the leaves turn an intense orange-red color in the Fall.	
Ginkgo	<i>Ginkgo biloba</i>	60'+ X 30'	Oval	D	SUN	This ancient living fossil tree has no pest problems. Uniquely fan shaped foliage has bright yellow fall color. The leaves all fall at once for easy rake-up. This variety is a non-fruiting male. A staff favorite!	
Holly, 'Fosteri'	<i>Ilex x attenuata</i>	15'-20' X 10'	Upright, Contained	E	S/PSH	Slender pyramidal form. Dark green foliage with deep red berries in the fall. Can be tree like.	
Holly, Possumhaw	<i>Ilex decidua</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Upright, Shrubby	D	S/PSH	Multi-trunked with small leaves. Females have persistent red berries in winter. Great tree for winter color. Drought tolerant.	
Holly, 'Savannah'	<i>Ilex x attenuata</i>	20'-30' X 15'	Upright, Pyramidal	E	S/PSH	Upright pyramidal growth habit. Light green leaves with red berries in the fall. Prefers sandy or acid soil.	
Holly, Yaupon	<i>Ilex vomitoria</i>	15'-20' X 12'	Upright, Shrubby	E	S/SH	Native slow grower with small evergreen leaves. Multi-trunked tree with females having red berries in winter. Tolerates less than perfect drainage, but needs watering in summer. Attracts wildlife.	
Italian Cypress	<i>Cupressus sempervirens</i>	20'-30' X 4'	Upright, Contained	E	SUN	Upright columnar shape makes this plant excellent for accent. Tolerates hot dry conditions once established. Plant is evergreen.	
Magnolia, 'Little Gem'	<i>Magnolia grandiflora</i>	20'-30' X 10'	Upright, Contained	E	S/PSH	Slow grower. Pretty, 6" cream flowers in summer. Underside of leaf is brown. Great small specimen tree.	
Magnolia, Saucer	<i>Magnolia soulangiana</i>	15'-20' X 10'	Open Irregular	D	PSH/S	Moderate grower. Large, tulip-shaped pink flowers in late winter on bare stems. Good specimen tree. Prefers acidic soil, but adapts to any well drained well mulched soil.	
Magnolia, Southern	<i>Magnolia grandiflora</i>	60'+ X 30'	Spreading with age	E	S/PSH	Native, moderate grower. Large, cream-colored lemon fragrant blooms in late spring and summer. Impressive, large shiny foliage. Needs well drained soil. Roots are very shallow. Keep their temperature steady by mulching year-round.	
Magnolia, Star	<i>Magnolia stellata</i>	15'-20' X 10'	Open Spreading	D	PSH	Star-like flowers float effortlessly in late winter on this understory shrub. Dense and compact with slow to moderate growth. Makes a great accent tree.	
Maple, Big Tooth	<i>Acer grandidentatum</i>	30'-40' X 15'	Open Spreading	D	S/PSH	Good drought tolerant native tree for alkaline soil with fantastic red and gold fall foliage. Needs good drainage, and reasonable watering to get established. Moderate growth rate.	
Maple, 'October Glory'	<i>Acer rubrum</i>	60'+ X 50'	Upright, Spreading	D	S/PSH	Glossy green leaves that turn scarlet to crimson in fall. Moderately tolerant to drought, but prefers a moist location.	
Maple, 'Red Sunset'	<i>Acer rubrum</i>	40'-60' X 35'	Upright, Spreading	D	SUN	One of the best for outstanding fall color. Retains its brilliant red to orange autumn color longer than most varieties. Lustrous green summer foliage and silvery bark for winter interest complete its attributes.	
Maple, Shantung	<i>Acer truncatum</i>	20'-30' X 20'	Pyramidal	D	S/PSH	Great small shade tree. Adapts well to alkali clay soil with good drainage. Very drought resistant once established. Brilliant fall colors of red, orange, and gold. Plus, interesting furrowed bark.	
Mesquite, Honey or Texas	<i>Prosopis glandulosa</i>	15'-20' X 25'	Irregular, Spreading	D	SUN	Creamy yellow flowers followed by beans on this irregular open tree. The foliage is ferny lime green and casts light shade. A very hardy, long-lived tree with high ornamental value.	
Mexican Buckeye	<i>Ungnadia speciosa</i>	15'-20' X 20'	Upright, Shrubby	D	S/PSH	Medium size, open multi-stemmed small tree. Nice, pink spring flowers before the leaves. Interesting seed pods in summer. Very drought resistant.	
Mountain Laurel, 'Silver Peso'	<i>Sophora secundiflora</i>	10'-15' X 15'	Irregular, Spreading	E	S/PSH	A new silver leaved cousin of the Texas Mountain Laurel. Has the same fragrant purple flowers in spring. Reportedly it is somewhat more winter hardy than the species. Drought tolerant.

Mountain Laurel, Texas	<i>Sophora secundiflora</i>	10'-15' X 20'	Rounded	E	SUN	Small dense tree with fragrant purple flowers in spring. Needs a sheltered location, may be damaged below 10 deg. F. Drought tolerant.	
Oak, Bur	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i>	60'+ X 60'	Open Spreading	D	S/PSH	Native with acorns. Moderate grower. Very healthy and adaptable. Good shade tree.	
Oak, Chinquapin	<i>Quercus muhlenbergii</i>	60'+ X 50'	Narrow Rounded	D	S/PSH	Native w/ acorns. Moderate grower that needs good drainage. Good shade tree with attractive, glossy, wavy-edged foliage. Leaves are dark green above and silvery below and not very oak-like. Acorns are sweetest of any oak. Edible and wildlife love them.	
Oak, Emory or Holly	<i>Quercus emoryi</i>	30'-40' X 25'	Irregular, Spreading	E	S/PSH	Holly-like foliage on an open spreading drought resistant tree with sweet acorns. Needs very good drainage, and prefers a slightly acidic soil. Plant in pine bark and rock in raised beds.	
Oak, Lacey	<i>Quercus laceyi</i>	20'-30' X 15'	Small, rounded	D	S/PSH	Native with acorns. Moderate grower. Leaves emerge peach in spring, change to a soft blue-green in summer, and then turning dark peach in fall.	
Oak, Live or Escarpment	<i>Quercus virginiana (fusiformis)</i>	40'-60' X 60'	Spreading	E	SUN	Classic southern live oak. Moderate growth rate. Long lived tree with open spreading branching. Coastal live oaks are Q. virginiana and inland oaks are Q. fusiformis. Hybrids are common.	
Oak, Monterrey, or Mexican White	<i>Quercus polymorpha</i>	30'-40' X 30'	Open Spreading	E	S/PSH	Evergreen or semi-evergreen with pink-peach new growth, and leathery blueish mature leaves. Tough and drought resistant once established. Fully hardy in Dallas. Good Drainage.	
Oak, Red Shumard or Texas	<i>Quercus shumardii (or buckleyii)</i>	60'+ X 60'	Upright, Spreading	D	S/PSH	Moderate to fast growth into a premium shade tree. Some individuals have great red foliage in fall. Graceful spreading shape. Shumard and Texas red oak are adapted to alkaline soil. All other "red" oaks and hybrids are not.	
Palm, California Fan	<i>Washingtonia filifera</i>	30'-40' X 15'	Upright, Spreading	E	S/PSH	The largest fast growing palm for our area. Develops a very broad crown that casts great shade. A great no mess poolside plant. Young palms need to be protected by wrapping their first two winters. Hardy to 10 degrees.	
Palm, Pindo/Jelly Palm	<i>Butia capitata</i>	15'-20' X 12'	Upright, Rounded	E	S/PSH	Pindo Palm is the only good feather type palm for the Dallas area. It is fully hardy to 15 degrees with no damage, and survives into the mid-single digits. Blueish-silvery fronds, and edible fruit. Protect first 2 winters.	
Palm, Windmill	<i>Trachycarpus fortunei</i>	15'-20' X 12'	Upright, Contained	E	S/PSH	A fairly fast growing, reliably hardy medium sized forming palm. The leaves are about 3 feet wide, and the trunk is under 1 foot in diameter, ideal for pool patios. Wrap the trunk for its first two winters.	
Peach, Double White Flowering	<i>Prunus persica</i>	15'-20' X 20'	Open Spreading	D	S/PSH	Spectacular, large, snow white double blossoms. One of the showiest of all flowering trees. Prune after bloom for best results next year.	
Peach, Peppermint Flowering	<i>Prunus persica</i>	15'-20' X 20'	Open Spreading	D	S/PSH	Numerous fluffy double carnation-like pale pink to white flowers streaked with red, resembling a peppermint. Early flowering.	
Peach, Red Flowering	<i>Prunus persica</i>	15'-20' X 20'	Open Spreading	D	S/PSH	Beautiful red carnation-like blooms cover this small tree in early spring.	
Pear, 'Aristocrat'	<i>Pyrus calleryana</i>	30'-35' X 35'	Upright, Rounded	D	SUN	Moderate grower. White flowers appear in early spring, glossy foliage and bright fall colors. Resistant to insects & disease. More open in form than Bradford, less subject to breakage with age.	
Pear, 'Bradford'	<i>Pyrus calleryana</i>	30'-40' X 35'	Upright, Contained	D	SUN	Moderate grower. White flowers in early spring with good fall foliage color. Very upright formal habit with tear-drop shape.	
Pine, Afghan	<i>Pinus eldarica</i>	40'-60' X 20'	Upright, Pyramidal	E	SUN	Very fast grower that is also extremely drought tolerant once established. Tolerates alkali-clay soil soils with good drainage. Grows best from the metroplex west.	
Pine, Austrian Black	<i>Pinus nigra</i>	30'-40' X 30'	Pyramidal	E	SUN	Denseley branched, pyramidal evergreen tree with dark green needles. Moderate growth rate slows with age. Adaptable to alkaline clay soil with good drainage. Drought resistant once established. One of the best pines for areas with black clay soil.	
Pine, Japanese Black	<i>Pinus thunbergiana</i>	40'-60' X 25'	Irregular, Spreading	E	SUN	Rapid grower. Irregular branching.	
Plum, Mexican	<i>Prunus mexicana</i>	20'-30' X 25'	Rounded	D	SUN	Native, small ornamental tree very well adapted to Texas. White, fragrant flowers in spring. Interesting reddish-brown peeling bark. Small edible plums. Does not sucker.	
Plum, Purpleleaf	<i>Prunus cerasifera</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Rounded	D	S/PSH	Fast grower. Ornamental accent tree with pink flowers in spring. Dark burgundy foliage. Needs good drainage and air circulation.

Redbud, Mexican	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> <i>var. mexicana</i>	10'-15' X 10'	Spreading	D	SUN	Smaller waxy leaves with a downy pubescences and wavy edges plus purplish-pink flowers distinguish this redbud from the larger eastern one.	
Redbud, 'Oklahoma'	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> <i>var. texensis</i>	10'-15' X 15'	Somewhat Rounded	D	PSH	Moderate grower. Deep purplish fuschia blossoms cover the branches in spring. Attractive glossy leaves.

Rosewood, 'Chisos'	<i>Vauquelinia</i> <i>corymbosa</i> <i>var.</i> <i>angustifolia</i>	15'-20' X 30'	Upright, Shrubby	E	SUN	Spectacular foliage with long, narrow, sharply toothed, dark green leaves and dense clusters of fragrant, white flowers that cover the tree in the spring. Very hardy, drought resistant and adaptable.	
Rosewood, 'Nuevo Leon'	<i>Vauquelinia corymbosa</i> <i>var. heterodon</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Open Spreading	E	SUN	Similar to the Chiso Rosewood, but with coarser foliage. Identical growth, hardiness and flowering habits. A very good small evergreen ornamental shrub/tree for low maintenance, low water landscapes. 0 deg. F.	
Rusty Blackhaw	<i>Viburnum rufidulum</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Upright, Shrubby	D	S/SH	Glossy leaves, fragrant white flowers, blue berries, and purple, orange and pink fall colors make this one of the most attractive Dallas native ornamental trees.	
Smoketree, 'Royal Purple'	<i>Cotinus coggygria</i>	10'-15' X 10'	Upright, Rounded	D	S/PSH	Pinkish-purple, smoke-like airy seed clusters backed by burgundy foliage. Foliage holds color well into summer, turning scarlet in fall.

Sweetgum	<i>Liquidambar styraciflua</i>	60'+ X 40'	Upright, Rounded	D	S/PSH	Fast grower. Exceptional fall color. Spiny fruit appears fall through winter.	
Sweetwood, Arroyo	<i>Myrospermum sousanum</i>	15'-20' X 15'	Upright, Spreading	D	S/PSH	This new south west native bears white clusters of pea-like blooms. Sweet spicy cinnamon vanilla fragrance. Light green compound leaves turn to gold in the fall. Drought tolerant. A Lynn Lowery introduction. Zone 8	
Texas Ash	<i>Fraxinus texensis</i>	30'-40' X 25'	Upright, Rounded	D	S/PSH	Native, medium-sized shade tree. Gorgeous fall colors of golden to copper to purple foliage, sometimes all on the same tree. Mature trees color best. Drought resistant, with a well behaved root system.	
Texas Ebony	<i>Pithecellobium flexicaule</i>	15'-20' X 20'	Irregular, Spreading	E	SUN	Acacia-like leaves on interesting zig-zaging twigs and white powder-puff-like flowers make this an interesting addition or focal point. Great in containers, or as bonsai subjects. Native to the Rio Grande Valley. Hardy to 10 deg. F and may require shelter.	
Wax Myrtle	<i>Myrica cerifera</i>	15'-20' X 6' - 10'	Rounded	E	S/PSH	Airy, aromatic small multi-stemmed tree with small, waxy berries. Tolerates wet soil. Very hardy and tolerant of adverse conditions.	
Whitebud, Texas	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> <i>var. texensis alba</i>	10'-15' X 15'	Upright, Spreading	D	S/PSH	White flowering form of the Texas redbud. Smaller and prettier than the eastern redbud.
