Emerald Velvet Okra	Sun	Summer	Plant produces heavy yields of 9" long dark green okra. The pods are thick walled, tender, and spineless. Stays tender even when very large. Retains color when frozen or canned. Excellent for soups, stews, and fried or boiled.

Radicchio 'Trevisio Red Preco'	Sun	7 weeks	This great addition to any salad, has remarkable color ranging from pink to maroon with white rib markings. The leaf texture is similar to endive. The leaves are tender but firm with a slightly bitter taste that adds zest to your recipes. Space plants 8 inches apart for a good harvest.
Radicchio, 'Augusto'	Sun	8-10 weeks	Deep burgundy, tight, red head. A gourmet salad vegetable. Leaves are slightly bitter like Endive, but are sweetest in cool weather. Frost tolerant variety.
Radicchio 'Red Leaf'	Sun	8-10 weeks	The delicious leaves of this plant will dress up your salads. Plant in fertile, moist soil. Harvest when the heart develops to a good size.
Asparagus			
Asparagus	Sun		Steamed asparagus spears are the rewards of this perennial. Feed early spring and after harvest with a complete organic fertilizer. Harvest when the young shoots are 6-10" tall in spring by cut at ground level. Allow plants to grow for two years before first harvest. A well maintained asparagus garden can produce for many years. At planting be sure to add lots of organic matter to at least a foot depth to attain good growth.

Broccoli 'Green Comet'	Sun	8 weeks	Fresh steamed broccoli is one the best vegetables to serve to your family. Broccoli is high in vitamins A, D, and beta carotene. 'Green Comet' broccoli produces large dark heads 3/4lb and 5 inches in diameter.
Cabbage	Sun	70-85 days	One of the oldest known vegetables. Space 18" X 30" apart. Fertilize, mulch and water. Prefers cool temperatures. Pick when firm. Popular boiled or stir fried.
Broccoli 'Marathon'	Sun	8-10 weeks	Cooked or eaten raw, broccoli is one of the best vegetables to feed your family. The variety Marathon develops large green heads 6-8 inch span on heavy stalks. Side shoots develop smaller heads with a 2-3 inch span.
Kohlrabi 'General Care'	Sun	40-60 days	The stem forms an edible bulb. Best in cool temperatures with moist, rich soil. Space 1' X 1 1/2'. Slice raw for salads or steam until tender.
Kohlrabi, Purple	Sun to Part Shade	7-10 weeks	Best in cool temps with moist, rich soil. Raw for salads or steam until tender. Harvest the bulbs when 2" or less in size while temperatures are still cool. Similar in taste to turnips though much sweeter. The leaves are also edible and great added to salads.
Cauliflower 'Amazing'	Sun	75 days	Produces bright dense heads with thick leaf jackets. Holds well in the garden so don't harvest a at once.
Cauliflower	Sun	50-70 days	Tie the outer leaves over developing heads to prevent yellowing. Cauliflower enjoys ample water and fertilizer. Space 18" by 30" in full sun.
Brussel Sprouts 'Jade Cross'	Sun to Part Shade	10-12 weeks	Great source of Vitamin C, Brussels sprouts have a mild cabbage flavor. This cold hardy vegetable benefits being planted in a well draining organic soil. Jade Cross variety is tall plant to about 22 inches with good production. Flavor improves after a light frost. Late in season, pinch out central growing stalk to promote side sprouts.
Cauliflower 'Violet Queen'	Sun	50-55 days	The purple heads of this variety resemble broccoli more than cauliflower. It is very easy to grow and cold tolerant. Use fresh in salads.
Kale 'Nero Di Toscana'	Sun		Eye-catching 'Black Palm' kale. Leaves resemble a palm tree. 3" wide, 10" long. Winter hardy. Tasty and ornamental.
Cabbage 'Savory Express'	Sun to Part Shade		Early, small, sweet 6-8" round heads have lovely crinkled leaves.
Mustard, Red Giant	Sun to Part Shade	Winter - Spring	Ornamental as well as tasty. Deep purple-red with white ribs, the savoyed leaves are thick and tender with a pleasantly mild mustard flavor. Harvest when young and tender. The plant is winter hardy and slow to bolt. Tender leaves can be eaten in raw salads. Leaves can also be steamed, boiled or stir fried.
Cabbage 'Ruby Ball'	Sun	8-10 weeks	Attractive firm deep red heads with short cores with a mild sweet flavor. Ruby ball holds its color well when cooked making for an eye pleasing dish. High in vitamin C and fiber, be sure to shred some for a great coleslaw. Be sure to work in some organic fertilizer into the soil around each plant. Rotate all cabbage crops every 3 years.
Collards 'Georgia'	Sun	8 weeks	To 3' tall, space rows 2 1/2' apart and plants 12"-18" apart. Collards are very cold hardy. Water well and pick leaves as needed when young and small ribbed. Cook like spinach and cover with butter or cream sauce.
Cauliflower 'Snow Crown'	Sun	7 weeks	Very early, pure white heads up to 2 lbs. Try raw with dips or broken into salads. Tie outer leaves over developing heads to prevent yellowing. Do not let water collect inside the leaves when blanching. Likes loose, rich, well drained soil, alkaline soil (pH 6.0 to 6.8). Rotate all cole crops by 3 years.

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Cabbage, 'Stonehead'	Sun	7 weeks	Disease resistant hybrid produces solid 3.5 lb heads. Excellent for use in coleslaw, sauerkraut, or cooking (boiled or stir fried). Fertilize, mulch and keep watered. Heads mature to best quality in cool weather. Best if pH 6.0 to 6.8. Harvest when firm.	
Cabbage 'Ruby Perfection'	Sun	85 days	Space this variety 18" by 30" apart in full sun. Excellent for canning. Fertilize, mulch, and keep thoroughly watered.	
Collards	Sun	8 weeks	Collards are a wonderful addition to any meal. The leaves are rich in vitamins and minerals and have a cabbage-like flavor. Collards are high nitrogen users that benefit from compost being added to the soil to at least 10 inches.	
Broccoli	Sun	40-70 days	Space 18" X 30" apart in fertile soil. Best quality in cool weather and full sun. Mulch and water well. Pick before flowers show.	
Kale, Salad	Sun to Part Shade	50-70 days	Very nutritious, contains high amounts of vitamin C and Beta-Carotene. Cooked as greens or raw in salads or garnish.	
Broccoli 'Packman'	Sun	8 weeks	Early or late, dependable. Growers' choice, good appearance, compact, great taste. Packman produces a dark green central head quickly, with harvestable side shoots soon after the head is cut. The uniform heads are large, tight with a good dome. Plant height 27".	
Eggplant				
Eggplant, 'Dusky'	Sun		These beautiful eggplants can even be used as ornamentals with their purple flowers. They produce large, dark purple, oval shaped fruits on disease-resistant plants. 'Dusky' produces a high yield especially in hot summers and needs warm nights and pollination to set fruits. Picking the eggplants before they get large will promote more fruits.	
Garlic				
Garlic 'Georgian Crystal'	Sun	June	This variety has large fat clean white cloves that are very mild. They are also flavorful raw and have a long storage life.	
Garlic, Elephant	Sun	June	Similar to regular garlic in every way, only up to 8 times larger. Harvest after the foliage dries in late spring. Great for baking, as it is sweet and mild.	
Garlic, "Russian Red"	Sun	June	A very hardy hard-neck garlic, with a strong warm taste and sweet after-taste. Purple striped skins peel easily.	
Garlic, New York White	Sun		Cover with 1-2" of soil. Needs a rich well drained soil. Water as needed and fertilize regularly. Water less when close to harvest. Harvest garlic cluster when leaves lie down or begin to dry in mid to late summer.	
Greens				
Lettuce, Black Seeded Simpson	Sun to Part Shade	4-6 weeks	Black Seeded Simpson lettuce is popular both for providing an early harvest and for withstanding weather changes. You will enjoy the crisp tender leaves either in a salad or added to a sandwich.	
Lettuce, Red Oakleaf	Sun to Part Shade		This lettuce has colorful reds and oakleaf shape with a delicate texture and sweet flavor. Grows well in cold weather and does not easily bolt in hot weather. Great salad bowl lettuce often used in restaurants. Pick leaves throughout the season.	
Mizuna Salad Greens	Sun to Part Shade	8-10 weeks	Mizuna is a Japanese variety of mustard greens. It's sweet and tangy flavor adds life to salads and stir-fries alike. While it is useful grown to eat, it can also add life to fall and spring flower beds. You will enjoy its leaf texture which is deeply fringed supported by lovely white slender stalks. To continuously enjoy this cut & come again salad green, be sure to lightly fertilize and water after each harvest.	
Mesclun Salad Greens	Sun to Part Shade	4-6 weeks	Mesclun salad greens are a mixture of different taste and texture to awaken your taste buds. Harvesting can start as soon as the leaves reach the height of 4 to 5 inches. Harvest the top 2 to 3 inches using sharp scissors. Mesclun greens are meant to be eaten while the leaves are young and tender. Enjoy this cut and come again greens.	
Swiss Chard 'Bright Lights'	Sun		This plant is not only good for eating with its succulent, sweet flavor, but it also makes a vibrant color display in yellows, pinks, crimsons, oranges, purples, whites and greens. Does well in containers also. Plant in spring or late summer. For harvesting, cut outer leaves as desired or cut back plant to 2" at any stage - it will grow new leaves.	
Red Swiss Chard	Sun	8 weeks	Plant in rows spaced 12" apart. Pick before outer leaves are 12". Adapts to heat and likes sun. Cook leaves like spinach or stalks like asparagus.	
Lettuce Redina	Sun to Part Shade	4-6 weeks	The dark burgundy curly leaves are attractive as well as tasty. Adding organic matter to your soil will allow the shallow roots to easily get established.	
Pac Choi 'Mei Qing Choi'	Sun		Flat, pale, misty green stems. Easy to grow. Perfectly formed for picking young 'baby size'.	
Chinese Cabbage 'Bok Choy'	Sun	10-12 weeks	The leaves and white ribs are eaten. Can be steamed, stir-fried or used in soups and other dishes. High in vitamin C, A and some calcium. Best in cool weather. Delicious sweet flavor. Fertilize, mulch and keep well watered. Likes a rich, well-drained, moist soil.	
Radicchio 'Fiero'	Sun	50-55 days	Tall 'romaine' type. Deep maroon heads with contrasting white ribs. Good in fresh salads. Grows like lettuce.	
Romaine Lettuce 'Devils Tongue'	Sun	50-55 days	Unique color and leaf shape. The newer leaves are a lovely deep red color. Best when picked as small heads. Rich flavor. Carefully break open, and sprinkle with a bit of oil and balsamic vinegar.	
Lettuce 'Romaine'	Sun	75-85 days	Tightly folded, crinkled green leaves perfect for salads. Space 12" X 18-24" apart in rich, well-drained soil with ample water.	
Radicchio 'Indigo'	Sun	50 days	Both hot and cold weather tolerant. Firm, medium large heads are a burgundy color with a great flavor. Very similar to raising lettuce. Great in fresh salads!	
Mustard Green 'Osaka Purple'	Sun		Green leaves with purple veins and purple overlay. Mild spicy taste is great in salads and stir-fry. Grows 8" tall.	
Lettuce 'Eruption'	Sun	50-55 days	Dark red and glossy, bibb-romaine cross. Unique, 8 inches tall. New growth is green. Adds color, texture and a fabulous taste to fresh salad mixes. Great in the gardens or containers!	
Mixed Greens	Sun to Part Shade		Adds crispy texture and fresh flavor. Use as garnish, on sandwiches, or in salads.	

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Spinach	Sun	40-60 days	Plant in early spring or fall, with 18-24" between rows. Spinach is very nutritional, delicious, and high yielding.	
Lettuce 'Freckles'	Sun	50-55 days	Red romaine is a striking salad mix addition. Bright green leaves with red spots make the leave look like confetti. Wonderful spring touch to gardens or containers.	
Greens, Claytonia 'Miner's Lettuce'	Sun to Part Shade	10-12 weeks	Cold hardy salad green. Pick young leaves for salads. Leaves quickly regrow for next harvest. Roots are also edible. Claytonia Miner's Lettuce came by its name during the gold rush in California, when miners would eat it for its Vitamin C content to help fend off scurvy. The leaves have a sweet taste and can be eaten raw or cooked like spinach.	
Asian Greens 'Autumn Poem'	Sun	8 weeks	Tender green leaves, stems and flowers are good raw in salads or steamed or stir-fried. Sweet, but with a bit of a bite.	
Pak Choi, Autumn Poem	Sun	7 weeks	The bright green leaves of this Japanese import have a sweet flavor that is good in salads and stir fry alike. There is little waste with this plant as all parts are edible. Harvest when plant goes to flower. Plant will provide multiple harvests.	
Leaf Lettuce 'Red Sails'	Sun	4-5 weeks	A.A.S. Winner. Bronze-red crinkled leaves. Space 12" X 18-24" apart. Rich, well-drained soil with ample water. Cool weather crop.	
Red Romaine Lettuce, 'Rouge D'Hiver	Sun	50 days	Old French variety with medium-red tinted leaves. Excellent taste. Cut baby leaves for salads.	
Heirloom Tomato				
Tomato, 'Stripped German'	Sun	10-12 weeks	Bicolored fruit of red and yellow. The flat, medium to large, ribbed shoulder tomatoes are shaded yellow and red. The marbled red and yellow interior looks beautiful sliced. Complex, fruity flavor with a smooth texture. Med-tall vines. Indeterminate; best if caged or staked.	
Tomato, 'Cherokee Purple'	Sun	10-12 weeks	Reliable producer of unusual medium to large flattened globe shaped pink-purple fruits that appear brown in color averaging 8-12 oz. Multicolored interior. Round fruit doesn't crack. Drought tolerant. Short, indeterminate vine that is best if staked.	
Tomato, 'Black Krim'	Sun	10-12 weeks	Fruits are large, up to 12 oz., with an unusual dark deep red, almost black color with heavy green shoulders. Interior is a deep, reddish green color. Sweet and tasty, making a fabulous BLT sandwich. Extremely early and indeterminate, so best if caged or staked.	
Tomato 'Brandywine'	Sun	10-12 weeks	This is an Amish variety that dates back to 1885. It is considered by many to be the best-flavored tomato. They produce very large, clear-skinned, rosy-pink fruits. The fruits can weigh up to 1 1/2 lbs.	
Tomato, 'Moschovich'	Sun	10-12 weeks	One of the most appealing extra early tomatoes. Fruits are deep red, and cold tolerant. Rich tasting, 4-6 oz., smooth, globe shaped fruits. Indeterminate; best if caged or staked.	
Tomato 'Mountain Gold'	Sun	10-12 weeks	This mountain variety is adapted for the southern states. Yellow-fruited, non-hybrid version. Fruits have good firmness that resist cracking and blossom endrot. Fruits are about 3 1/2" across with a nice flavor.	
Tomato 'Green Zebra'	Sun	10-12 weeks	This is an unusual variety. The fully ripe fruits are bright green, with stripes of still lighter green. Round, smallish fruits, 2-4 oz. each, have excellent tomato flavor. Plants are vigorous.	
Onion				
Onion, White Granex	Sun to Part Shade	Mid Spring	This variety is known for its sweetness and bright white beautiful bulbs. It is best when eaten raw. It makes a great mini onion when harvested early with the tops left on. Often referred to as the Society Onion or Texas Sweet. Stores one month.	
Onion, 10-15 Y	Sun to Part Shade	Mid Spring	Texas Supersweet Best Seller. The bigger it gets the sweeter it is. The 1015 stands for October 15, the day the seed should be planted in south Texas. The Y stands for yellow. Open pollinated. Stores for two months. Globe shaped.	
Onion, Red Burgundy	Sun to Part Shade	Mid Spring	Beautiful bright red, flat shaped 3-4" diameter with a tasty red ringed flesh. It is ideal for salads and sandwiches. Very mild and sweet. Short storage, may be picked young for bunching.	
Onion, Korean Heirloom	Sun	Winter - Spring	Perennial scallion type onion that multiplies. Divide and replant as the clumps grow. This old fashion oriental variety is very reliable.	
Onion, Yellow Granex	Sun to Part Shade	Mid Spring	This cross between the 1015Y and the old Bermuda onion produces semi-flat onions with rounded shoulders. Stores for one month.	
Peas				
Pea, 'Little Sweetie'	Sun	8 weeks	Great for stir-fry, this pea has an edible pod. This is a very early dwarf stringless variety bush version of the snow pea. Harvest when pea pods are flat and tender for best flavor. These peas are great eaten raw in salads.	
Pepper				
Sweet Pepper, Red Beauty	Sun	10-12 weeks	Sweet as well as beautiful these peppers are 3-4 lobed fruits with thick walls. Tasty and attractive in fresh salads or grill, roast or stir-fry. Plant in full sun 18"-24" apart in rows 24"-36" apart. Plant when weather and soil have thoroughly warmed. Mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds.	
Pepper, Bell 'Sun'	Sun		This bell pepper has golden yellow fruit that matures to bright red. Use fresh in salads or stir fry. Pick first fruits as they mature to encourage fruit to set. Space 18" - 30" apart when weather and soil have warmed. Mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds.	
Pepper, Jalapeno	Sun	10-12 weeks	Produces thick walled hot fruit with deep green color that matures to a bright red. Plant 18" - 30" apart when soil and weather have thoroughly warmed. Pick first fruits as they mature to encourage fruit to set. Mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds. Water well.	
Pepper, Banana 'Sweet Hungarian'	Sun	10-12 weeks	A profuse bearer of long sweet peppers that matures from yellow, orange, and then to crimson red. Excellent for pickling, frying or fresh in salads. Plant when weather and soil have warmed. Mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds. Water well.	
Pepper, Sweet Pimento	Sun to Part Shade	8-10 weeks	Delicious eaten fresh, the sweet pimento produces heavy yields of bright, red, heart shaped fruit with mild, sweet flavor. Harvest pimentos when fully mature and scarlet red. Excellent chopped and added to pasta salads or used for canning. Plant in well drained fertile soil with well decomposed compost when weather and soil have warmed. Mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds.	

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Sweet Pepper, 'Big Bertha'	Sun	10-12 weeks	Large, crisp, green 7"-10" fruits on upright plants. Plant in full sun. In hot climates some afternoon shade ok. Plant 18"-20" apart in rows 24"-36" apart.	
Pepper, T.A.M. Mild Jalapeno	Sun	10-12 weeks	Produces mildly hot fruit with firm, thick walls. Color changes from deep green to bright red at maturity. Space 18"-30" apart when weather warms. Mulch and keep well watered. Stake if necessary.	
PEPPER 'CHILE PEQUIN'	Sun to Part Shade	40-60 days	This is a very hot tiny pepper sometimes called "Bird's Eye" This pepper will usually act like a perennial, and return from the roots.	
Pepper, Bell 'California Wonder'	Sun to Part Shade	10-12 weeks	Produces good sized, blocky green fruit. Smooth thick walls are ideal for stuffing or fresh salads. When peppers are more mature, they are sweeter, more nutritious and turn crimson red. Plant when weather warms and night temperatures are above 55 degrees F. Water regularly. Mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds.	
Potato				
Potato, La Soda Red	Sun	60-90 days	Good boiling potato with high yields, shallow eyes, and good disease resistance.	
Potato, Kennebec	Sun	60-90 days	All purpose potato with high yields, tolerates adverse conditions, and is resistant to late-season blight. White flaky flesh.	
Root Crop				
Kale 'Redbor'	Sun		Unbelievable color and delicious taste. Finely curled leaves turn red as they mature in cool weather. Same sweet flavor as 'Winterbor'.	
Leeks 'King Richard'	Sun	8-10 weeks	The mild sweet onion flavor of the leek is perfectly suited to enriching the taste of soups and stews. This variety is early to mature and self-blanching. It produces long slender white stems which are topped by light green leaves.	
Shallots	Sun	Winter - Spring	A necessity for fine French cooking, shallots are a mild aromatic vegetable with flavor midway between onions and garlic. Unlike their relatives, the onions, they produce clusters of bulbs. They will perennialize and multiply if left in their beds. They want well drained rich soil with plenty of compost.	
Tomato				
Tomato, 'Carnival' (VFFNT)	Sun	10-12 weeks	Compact, disease resistant vine produces high yields of firm, tasty fruit. Space or cage 2-3' apart when weather and soil have warmed. Plant so that lowest leaves are 1" above soil level. For best results use a tomato plant fertilizer.	
Tomato, 'Porter'	Sun	8-10 weeks	Produces heavy yields of pink egg-shaped fruits even in hot, dry weather. Delicious taste for canning, juice or for fresh eating. When weather and soil have warmed plant so that lowest leaves are 1" above soil level. For best results use a tomato plant fertilizer.	
Tomato, 'Viva Italia' (VFFN)	Sun	10-12 weeks	Produces high quality pear shaped fruit even in hot weather. Wonderful for home freezing, canning or fresh off the vine. Plant when weather has warmed so that lowest leaves are 1" above soil level. Compact habit is great for limited space garden. Cage or stake 2' - 3' apart. Roma for the sun.	
Tomato, 'Big Beef'	Sun	75 days	Large 12 oz fruit. Will tolerate cool and wet weather. Best when caged or staked.	
Tomato, 'Grape'	Sun	55 days	Disease resistant with clusters of fruit. Great until frost.	
Tomato 'Celebrity'	Sun	70-85 days	A.A.S. winner. This tomato is DISEASE RESISTANT. Plant when weather and soil are warm, with the lowest leaves 1" above soil level.	
Strawberry 'Sequoia'	Sun	60-70 days	Plant with crown above soil level. Space 18" apart in matted rows. Keep the large, dark red fruit picked for best yield.	
Tomato 'Beefmaster' VFN	Sun	10-12 weeks	F1 Hybrid. Improved beefsteak type produces 2 lb. fruit till late season. If planted early protect from frost. In hot climates, some afternoon shade is OK. Cage/stake these vigorous, strong plants 24-36" apart. For best results use a tomato plant fertilizer.	
Tomato, 'Supersweet 100' (VF)	Sun	8 weeks	Fruit size 1 oz. There is no better tasting tomato than fully vine ripened ones you grow yourself. 'Sweet 100's' produce large clusters of extremely sweet, bite sized fruit. Vines are disease resistant. Transplant so that leaves are 1" above soil level. Stake or cage vines 2'-3' apart. Cut less vigorous shoots near base to increase yield. Keep watered and fertilize monthly.	
Tomato, 'Super Fantastic' (VF)	Sun	10-12 weeks	Produces very tasty 10 oz. size fruits that are more heat tolerant than some varieties. Continually produces high yields of large fruit until frost. Plant when weather and soil have warmed so that bottom leaves are 1" above soil level. Best if caged or staked 24" - 36" apart.	
Tomato, 'La Roma'	Sun	8-10 weeks	Produces high yields of bright red plum-shaped 3-4 oz. fruits that are popular for use in making pastes. Plant 2 1/2 feet apart. No staking necessary. Plant so lowest leaves are 1" above soil level after weather has warmed.	
Tomato, 'Better Boy', VFN	Sun	10-12 weeks	Heavy producer of juicy, meaty, round, red fruits averaging 1 lb. Plant after last frost so lowest leaves are 1" above soil level. Best if caged or staked.	
Tomato 'Burpee Big Boy'	Sun	10-12 weeks	F1 Hybrid. High yields of 1-2 lb. thick walled fruit. When weather warms, plant lowest leaves 1' above soil. Protect from frost. In hot climates, some afternoon shade is OK. Cage/stake 24-36" apart. For best results use a tomato plant fertilizer.	
Tomato 'Early Girl Improved' (VFF)	Sun	8-10 weeks	Early slicing tomato. It is a sweet, juicy, loose textured, red tomato that has a long season of production. Indeterminate vine with high yields of tasty 5 oz. fruits. Protect from frost. In hot climates, some afternoon shade is OK. Cage/stake 24-36" apart. For best results use a tomato plant fertilizer.	
Tomato 'Merced'	Sun	60-70 days	Plant when weather and soil are warm, so lowest leaves are 1" above soil level. Best caged or staked.
