

SUCCULENT CARE TIPS:

- Light: Place plants in bright light only, with no direct sun at first. Move to stronger light gradually over 1-2 weeks.
- **Soil:** Use a mix designed for succulents, or mix 1/2 perlite or pumice with 1/2 potting soil (without fertilizer).
- Water: Water entire container thoroughly until water flowers freely from the bottom of the container, then wait until soil becomes completely dry before watering again.
- **Drainage:** Water must drain freely from the soil. If protecting surfaces with a saucer, make sure to pour any standing water out.
- **Feeding:** Any liquid food diluted to 1/4 strength during the growing season only.
- Other: Can be kept outdoors during warm months, but most are not reliably hardy and are best kept indoors during winter cold.



- Light: Medium to bright, indirect light is best.
- Soil: None needed!
- Water: Best spritzed daily, and happiest in high relative humidity (bathrooms and showers are ideal). Otherwise, soak weekly in rain, spring, or distilled water with liquid seaweed diluted to 1/4 strength. Allow to drip dry before placing back in mounting spot.
- Drainage: N/A
- **Feeding:** Liquid seaweed diluted to 1/4 strength is ideal for a weekly soak of 20-45 minutes.
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ORCHID CARE TIPS:

- Light: Bright, indirect light; such as near a window but out of direct sunlight.
- **Soil:** Use a mix designed for orchids with a well-aerated, bark-rich formula.
- Water: Most orchids are happiest with high relative humidity, such as near a sink or shower. Water sparingly—about 1-2x per week in most homes.
- **Drainage:** Water must drain freely from the soil. If protecting surfaces with a saucer, make sure to pour any standing water out.
- Feeding: Liquid seaweed applied 1x per month.
- Other: Different species need different care, so check online sources for your specific orchid to get more specific tips for success.



- Light: Most foliage houseplants appreciate moderate to bright, indirect light—never direct sun-light.
- **Soil:** Use a light, well-draining potting media and enhance with perlite or charcoal as needed to ensure good drainage.
- Water: Water entire container thoroughly until water flowers freely from the bottom of the container, then wait until soil surface is dry before watering again.
