Benjamin Britten®	Reddish Pink	The unique shade of deep red-pink makes this rose glow in the landscape. Large rosette-shaped blooms with an intense fruity fragrance. Reblooming with a dense upright growth habit. Petal count 60.
Bring Me Sunshine®	Apricot	A warm and inviting variety bearing deeply filled, cupped rosette blooms of rich sunset orange-yellow paling to lighter apricot tones over time. A healthy and upright, bushy shrub with a complex medium-strong myrrh fragrance. Petal count 75+.
Carding Mill® !	Apricot	Large blooms in shades of pink, apricot and yellow. Strong, beautiful myrrh fragrance. Repeats well. Enjoys warmer climates. Petal count 80.
Charles Darwin * !	Yellow	Full, rounded blooms in a beautiful shade of yellow. The fragrance is strong with a luscious scent of soft floral tea and pure lemon. Reblooming. Petal count 140.
CL Bathsheba® !	Apricot	English Climbing Rose. Apricot-yellow buds open to shallowly cupped, many-petaled rosettes. They are a beautiful blend of subtle apricot-pink and soft yellow with the outer petals fading to cream. The myrrh fragrance has hints of honey and tea. Repeat flowering, blooms on old wood and new wood. Petal count 170.
CL Claire Austin *	White	English Climbing Rose. Pale lemon-yellow buds open to reveal large, multi-petaled blooms. Grown as an arching shrub or climber. Repeat flowering, blooms on old wood and new wood. Complex myrrh and vanilla fragrance. Petal count 120.
CL James Galway® !	Pink	English Climbing Rose. The strikingly beautiful flowers are mid pink at the center, becoming lighter towards the edges. The numerous, neatly placed petals create a slightly domed shape. Named after the Irish flautist. Repeat bloomer. Petal count 130.
CL Malvern Hills®	Soft Yellow	English Rambling Rose. A repeat-flowering rose, bearing fully double, soft yellow blooms, which are held in medium to large clusters. It is very healthy with strong, slender growth, attractive polished foliage and few thorns. Light musk fragrance. Petal count 40.
CL Strawberry Hill *	Pink	English Climbing Rose. Beautiful at all stages, bearing small clusters of medium-pink, cupped rosettes. The blooms have a strong, delicious myrrh and heather honey fragrance. Reblooming. Petal count 120.
CL Teasing Georgia® !	Yellow	English Climbing Rose. Beautifully formed, golden yellow blooms with a lovely, strong tea fragrance. An easy-to-grow English climber for your rose garden. Shows good disease resistance and repeat flowering. Petal count 110.
CL The Albrighton Rambler™	Blush Pink	English Rambling Rose. A repeat-flowering variety. The petals of each bloom are beautifully arranged around a little button eye; the overall appearance being one of exceptional prettiness and charm. Petal count 85+.
CL The Lady of the Lake®	Pale Pink	English Rambling Rose. Pale pink, semi-double flowers, each about 2" across, are held in sprays on long, slender, flexible stems. Reblooming, with a nice citrus fragrance. Petal count 21-40.
CL The Pilgrim® !	Soft Yellow	English Climbing Rose. Gorgeous large, cupped soft yellow blooms have a heady myrrh scent. Repeat flowering. Petal count 140.
Darcey Bussell *	Crimson	Deep crimson rosettes with a delightful fruity fragrance. An exceptional variety which flowers freely and rebloom. Compact, bushy growth. Petal count 70.
Elizabeth® *	Pale pink-apricot	New in 2024. A majestic rose bearing clusters of large, crisp apple blossom pink rosettes, shading to the gentlest blush white. Fragrance is strong, sweet, and fresh with hints of lemon sherbet and Old Rose. Repeat blooming. Petal count 40.
Gabriel Oak *	Deep Pink	The many-petaled rosette blooms are a striking shade of deep pink, the outer petals of each bloom paling slightly over time. The beauty of the blooms is enhanced by a wonderful, strong fruity fragrance. Repeat flowering. Petal count 50+.
Golden Celebration® !	Gold	Large golden blooms have a strong tea fragrance with a hint of strawberry. Forms a rounded, arching shrub or may be used as a climber. Repeat flowering. Petal count 70.
James L Austin *	Cerise Pink	Large rosettes of deep pink with a light fruity scent. Growth habit is compact and bushy; an excellent choice for containers. Petal count 40+.

Rose varieties are in two types: 'grafted' roses have flower traits matched to a vigorous root stock and establish quickly; 'own-root' roses are younger, take slightly longer to establish, and are longer lived.

The surrounding outer petals are salmon-pink with beautifully contrasting golden-yellow undersides. There is a pleasant, warm Tea fragrance, with hints of spiced apple and cloves. Repeat flowering. Petal count 60.
Lichfield Angel® !	Cream	A vigorous, rounded shrub with apricot buds that open to reveal creamy white, dome-shaped blooms. Light, spicy scent. Repeat flowering. Petal count 100.
Princess Anne™	Cerise Pink	Large, fragrant clusters of cerise-pink blooms are lightly brushed with yellow on the underside of the petals. Repeat flowering. Petal count 85.
Roald Dahl®	Apricot	Soft orange-red buds open to medium-sized, cupped rosettes of perfect apricot. An extremely robust rose with a lovely, fruity tea scent. Repeat flowering. Petal count 55.
The Poet's Wife * !	Yellow	A truly gorgeous yellow rose which will brighten up your garden. The deep, sunny yellow cupped blooms have a remarkable fruity fragrance that is absolutely delightful. Repeat flowering. Petal count 77.
Thomas à Becket®	Crimson	The informal rosette flowers are a striking crimson-red. Held in medium-large sized heads, they nod attractively on their stems. The Old Rose fragrance has a lemony zest. Petal count 63.
Tottering-by-Gently * !	Yellow	Its beauty is found in the simplicity of its single yellow flowers and the spectacular display they create when viewed en masse. They are held in large, open sprays on a rounded, branching shrub. Repeat flowering with a light musk fragrance. Petal count 5.
Vanessa Bell® !	Pale Yellow	Pink-tinged buds open to medium-sized cups held in large clusters. Pale yellow shading to white at the edges; each has a rich yellow eye. The fragrance is similar to green tea with aspects of lemon and honey. Repeat flowering. Petal count 60+.
Windermere™	Cream	Perfectly rounded buds open to full, cupped flowers that are rich cream at first, fading to almost pure white in the sun. Fragrant fruity essence with grapefruit overtones. Repeat flowering with good disease resistance. Petal count 80.

Arborose® Florentina™ * !	Red	A very robust and hardy climber with nostalgic, quartered, bright-red flowers in clusters. Compact in size but a terrific impact on any fence or wall. Repeat flowering. Petal count 40.
Arborose® Kiss Me Kate * !	Pink	The extremely fragrant, medium-pink blooms sport a classical bud shape. A vigorous climber with good disease resistance. The long stems provide the perfect blooms for cutting and using in arrangements. Repeat flowering. Petal count 35-40.
Arborose® Tangerine Skies * !	Orange	A fragrant repeat bloomer in shades of orange with good disease resistance. Petal count 17-25.
Don Juan	Red	Favored by rosarians and gardeners alike for more than half a century. Dark red, fragrant flowers will cover this rose once established. Blooms on old and new wood. Petal count 30-35.

Always Dream !	Pink	2022. Texas Pioneer. Semi-double pink blooms open to reveal bright golden stamen. The informal cascading growth habit make this a great rose for growing in containers. Reblooming with rose hips appearing in late fall-winter. Petal count 20+.

Baronne Prevost !	Pink	1842. Hybrid Perpetual. Fat, flat, cupped blooms are very fragrant. Repeat bloomer. Petal count 40 plus.
Blush Noisette !	Blush Pink	1817. Noisette. Soft pink double blooms are produced in clusters of 6 to 12. Light clove fragrance. Repeat blooming. Petal count of 25-40.
Carefree Beauty !	Pink	1977. Buck Rose. This vigorous, upright shrub rose sports smooth, olive-green leaves and clusters of cup-shaped, semi-double, fragrant, bubble-gum pink flowers from spring to fall. Large rose hips add late fall to winter interest AKA 'Katy Road Pink'. Petal count 16-20. Earth-Kind® Rose.
CL Albéric Barbier !	Creamy White	1900. Rambler. Yellow buds open into fully double creamy white flowers, each about 3" across, held in small clusters. Repeat blooming. Petal count 40+.
CL Climbing Pinkie !	Rose	1952. Polyantha. Rose pink, cupped shaped blooms are produced in clusters of great profusion. The nearly thornless canes are easy to work with when training as a climber. Fragrant and reblooming. Petal count 15-25. Earth-Kind® Rose.
CL Heavenly Ascent * !	White	2022. Texas Pioneer. A mannerly climber reaching up to 10 feet, 'Heavenly Ascent®' is perfect for a pillar or trellis where her very full, fragrant, cream-colored flowers will catch the eye (and noses) of passersby. Repeat blooming with hips forming for fall-winter interest. Petal Count 75+.
CL Lady Banks Yellow !	Yellow	1824. Species. A thornless climber with clusters of fragrant, small double yellow flowers. Spring blooming only. Petal count 26-40.
CL Mme. Alfred Carriere !	White	1879. Noisette. A strong, reliable climbing rose. Large, sweetly scented, cupped blooms; creamy white tinted with pink. Flowers freely and continually. Petal Count 30.
CL Old Blush !	Pink	UNK. China Climber. Heavy bloomer and very hardy. Repeat bloomer. Petal count 9-15.
CL Red Cascade !	Red	1976. Climber. Profuse bloomer covered in one-inch red flowers. Repeat blooming. Petal count 15-25.
CL Sombreuil !	White	1850. Tea. Creamy-white blooms are very large, flat, and quartered, with a most delicious tea rose fragrance. This mannerly climber is ideally suited for use as a pillar rose, or trained on a low wall, fence, or trellis. Petal count 40 plus.
Cramoisi Superieur !	Crimson	1832. China. This fine old rose has velvety, rich crimson flowers with a silvery reverse and a deliciously fruity fragrance. Often found growing in country gardens and abandoned homesteads across Texas. Petal count 15-25.
Duchesse de Brabant !	Pink	1857. Tea. The cupped pink flowers have a cabbage-like roundness to them, as if they were picked from a luscious old rose painting. Repeat blooming with good disease resistance. Petal count 20-40. Earth-Kind® Rose.
Fragrant Blush !	Pink	2019. Texas Pioneer. 'Fragrant Blush' is a cross of two extremely fragrant roses, 'Dee-Lish' and 'Scepter'd Isle®'. What makes this rose even more special is it's heat tolerance to our hot Texas summers. Petal count 40 plus.
Francis Dubreuil !	Red	1894. Tea. Beautifully formed buds open to a full velvety crimson bloom very similar to that of a camellia. The plant is robust and very remontant. Old tea rose fragrance and a repeat bloomer. Petal count 30-60.
Gruss an Aachen !	Pale Pink	1909. Floribunda - Believed to be the original rose that began the Floribunda class. Buds open to reveal large pale pink, double blooms that fade to a creamy white with age. Light sweet fragrance. Repeat bloomer. Petal count 40 plus.
La Vicomtesse !	Pink	2022. Texas Pioneer. The medium pink, very double-shaped 'La Vicomtesse' flowers have the old-fashioned shape we all love. This rose is similar to those depicted in several 18th-century paintings. Very fragrant and reblooming, producing rose hips in fall-winter Petal count 40+.
Magnolia Memories !	Pink	2022. Texas Pioneer. With outstanding vigor and prolific blooming power, 'Magnolia Memories' should be a focal point in any garden. This rose is the hardiest, cleanest, and most disease-resistant rose that we have produced thus far. Reblooming with hips in fall-winter Petal count 25+.
Marie Daly !	Pink	1999. A sport of 'Marie Pavie' with clusters of medium pink, double flowers. Fragrant, repeat blooming and almost thornless. Petal count 15-25. EarthKind® Rose.
Marie Pavie !	Cream	1888. Polyantha. Nearly thornless rose. Musk fragrance. Pink buds open to clusters of creamy white blooms. Petal count 15-25.
Martha Gonzales !	Scarlet	1984. China. Bright scarlet, neat single flowers open flat to decorate a bushy shrub whose neat foliage has a dark red tinge. Petal count 15-25.
Mme. Antoine Mari !	Pink	1901. Tea. Mildly fragrant, pink flowers that fade to cream. Blooms almost non-stop. Full, rounded growth habit. Petal count 15-40. EarthKind® Rose
Mme. Antoine Rebe !	Red	1900. Tea. The single blooms look like big butterflies in varying shades of pink to red floating above dark green foliage. Repeat blooming. Petal count 10-15.
Mme. Isaac Periere * !	Rose	1881. Bourbon. Fat cabbage-like flowers of rich rose madder. Extremely fragrant. Blooms mid-spring, scattered roses throughout summer with heaviest bloom in fall. Petal count 75+.
Mme. Joseph Schwartz !	White	1880. Tea. As a sport of 'Duchess de Brabant', it has the same habit and form except it is a pale white with a light pink blush. Lovely light tea fragrance and good repeat blooming. Petal Count 15-25.
Mutabilis !	Yellow & Red	Prior to 1894. China. A blend of colors changing from yellow to orange to red and finally crimson. Also known as the "Butterfly Rose." Repeat blooming. Petal count 5-7. EarthKind® Rose.
Penelope	Peach	1924. Hybrid musk. Clusters of large, fragrant, semi-double flowers adorn this compact rose during the growing season. Fat, orange-pink hips weigh down the bush in fall and winter. Petal count 25-30.
Prosperity	White	1919 Hybrid Musk. This rose produces a profusion of rosette-shaped ivory blossoms in large clusters. Pleasantly fragrant and blooms in flushes throughout the season. Petal count 9-16.
Spice	Pink	UNK. China. This rose produces pale pink, tea-like blooms on a three to four foot tall bush. Unique spicy fragrance. Good for cutting. Petal count 16-25. EarthKind® Rose.
Tuesday McMains !	Apricot	2022. Pioneer. This stunning shrub rose shows a profusion of delicate apricot semi-double blooms, making it a great choice for pollinators. In addition to the beautiful blooms and pleasant fragrance, this rose also sets bountiful hips. Petal count 20+.

ROSE CLASSIFICATIONS

Antique Roses

These Old Garden roses are naturally disease resistant, hardier and require less care than most other roses. Garden roses are generally very fragrant and adaptable to a variety of landscape situations. They have many classifications ranging from dwarfs to cluster blooms to climbers and everything in between. You can find these in the list under *Antique Rose Emporium*.

David Austin English Roses

These roses bring the romance and charm of the roses of years past to your garden. Their blooms are packed with layers of petals, appealing fragrances and soft coloring.

Climbing Roses

Many of our modern rose climbers originated from hybrid teas that have a tendency to grow unusually long canes. Climbers can grow to a length of 18 to 20 feet and bloom as profusely as many hybrid teas. Unlike other types of roses, climbers are not pruned heavily each spring. They should be selectively pruned after the first flush of blooms.

Florascape Roses

These hardy spreading roses quickly cover large areas creating a carpet of low maintenance color ideal for slopes and rocky areas. Great in baskets for trailing color.

Floribunda Roses

This type of rose began as a cross between Polyantha and hybrid tea. The cross was such a success that an entire new call of rose was named. These shrubs reach 2 ½ to 3 ½ feet in height, with dense branching. They are free blooming with small blooms in large clusters.

Grandiflora Roses

Queen Elizabeth, when it was introduced in 1955, was clearly an extraordinary rose. However, it did not fit any of the already existing classifications. It was, therefore, given the distinction of naming a rose category for it. This type usually ranges from 4 ½ feet upward with long stems sometimes supporting several blooms, but slightly smaller than hybrid tea. Most Grandiflora shrubs support a heavy compliment of blooms throughout the growing season and are an excellent source of flowers.

Hybrid Tea Roses

This is the best type for cut flowers since each stem has only one bloom. Bushes grow 3 ½ to 4 ½ feet tall and get bigger in ideal conditions. The Hybrid Tea is the most popular type of rose sold in America.

Miniature Roses

These roses are small in stature but are prolific bloomers. They generally do not exceed 2 feet tall and bloom continuously with small flowers. They are extremely low maintenance and are great for containers.

Shrub/Hedge Roses

These roses are easy-care, versatile and fragrant. They adapt well to many soils and temperatures. They have colorful hips throughout winter.

Texas Pioneer Roses

These roses are the result of crosses between some of Dr. Robert Basye's disease resistant varieties and David Austin's English Roses, Hybrid Perpetuals, Hybrid Teas and other large-flowering shrub roses. The roses are named for various people and places important to Texas heritage. You will find them to be beautiful, resilient and tough, much like the early Texas pioneers they honor. You can find these in the list under *Antique Rose Emporium*.
